Course Description

This course will focus on developing skills and attributes helpful to leadership in an engineering context. Students will learn about competencies developed by the Illinois Leadership Center (ILC) that are beneficial for leadership and ways to develop those skills throughout their college experience.

Course Materials

There are no specific texts for this class, although students will occasionally be asked to read articles online pertaining to course content. These articles and all course material will be provided. There will be a class workbook given to each student at the beginning of class, which will have relevant hand-outs, articles, and reflection questions to be completed in class. Students are expected to bring the workbook to each class. Completion of the workbook will count towards half of the participation grade for each day.

- 1. Attendance is required. Those attending and participating will receive full credit. There are 14 classes but total attendance points are based on 13 classes. Therefore, there is no need to report when missing your first class. No electronics are to be used during class unless necessary for the given lesson. Participation will be worth 10 points total each class..
- 2. Homework will be assigned each week (a total of 10 homework assignments, each worth 20 points) and is due the following week on Canvas. For every day an assignment is late, 10% of the possible grade will be deducted up to 50% of the total grade, unless previously discussed with instructor.
- 3. A 3-part reflection assignment will be assigned at the beginning of the semester, and parts will be completed throughout the semester.
