



FY 09 Annual Program

- As-Published:
 - \$1.95 billion program
 - 897 miles
 - 278 bridges (new, repl, rehab, repair)
 - 123 T/S sites (state & local)

ARRA – Federal Stimulus

- Signed Feb. 17, 2009
- \$936 million to IL for highways
- State share \$627 million
- Local Share \$281 million (formula breakout)
- Enhancements \$28 million
- 'Use it or lose it'
- 50% State share authorized in 120 days, remainder 1 year from allocation

Jump Start

- \$2.0 billion Series A bond Program
- 'State stimulus' program
- ~\$450 million in FY 09 (Special May Letting)
- ~\$1.55 billion in FY 10-15 MYP
- Mainly RS/Bridges
 - 1,216 miles, 73 bridges in 10-15
 - N/S Wacker Drive \$360 million

Emergency Repair

- Separate \$150 million RF appropriation
- Project solicitation process
 - MFT standards
 - \$300,000 minimum
- Local projects
- Legislator support required
- Implementation ongoing

Augmented FY 09 Program

- As-published + ARRA + Jump Start + ERP
- ~\$3.48 billion annual program (record)
- 2,491 miles
- 486 bridges
- 218 T/S locations

Illinois Jobs Now!

- \$3.06 billion in <u>specific</u> projects
- Mainly Congestion Mitigation & System Expansion
- Interstate reconstruction & capacity work
 - I-190, I-94, I-80, I-55, I-74, I-57/70
- Allows us to complete or advance the ball on expanding several corridors
 - Urban (US 6, IL 59, IL 47, IL 2, IL 71, IL 159, IL 13)
 - Rural (US 34, US 67, US 51, IL 29)

IJN — Cont'd

- Some local projects added
- 208 miles, 83 bridges, 43 T/S locations
- ~\$359 million PE/CE
- ~\$249 million LA

FY 10-15 MYP (MYP v2.0)

- Announced July 13
- 6 year \$14.314 billion (\$11.5 billion State)
- Improves:
 - 4,856 miles
 - 850 bridges
 - 324 T/S sites (state only)
 - 560 other bridge repairs
- Post-2015 expected System Condition:
 - 94% bridges (91% latest data)
 - 90% miles (86% latest CRS data)

FY 10-15 MYP, cont'd

- Includes both Jump Start and IJN projects
- Accounts for ARRA and Spring Repair in condition estimates

FY 10 Annual Program

- September 2009
- \$2.4 billion (new appropriations)
- 740 miles, 228 bridges, 125 T/S sites

Beyond SAFETEA-LU

- Expires 9/30/09
- Highway Trust Fund solvency Big issue, large planned rescission
- IL rescission share was \$290 million unobligated balances
- New Administration Priorities
- Expect extension for at least 1 year
- Expect CR of Appropriations as well

Farther Beyond

- IDOT (draft) Priorities:
 - More \$\$ to Illinois
 - Flexibility to use it
 - Interstate Reconstruction Program
 - More streamlining at federal level

Next MYP

- Tentatively FY 11-15 (5-year MYP)
- Size = Unknown
- Issues:
 - Implementation of IJN & Jump Start projects
 - Large, expensive, needed bridge projects
 - Interstate system we need to deal with it;
 condition, capacity, structures


THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009 (RECOVERY ACT)

ENACTED FEBRUARY 17, 2009

Recovery Act Highlights

- Signed into law on February 17, 2009
- \$787 billion total investment
- \$48.1 billion for transportation, including:
 - \$27.5 billion for highways
 - \$8.4 billion for transit
 - \$8.0 billion for high speed rail
 - \$1.3 billion for Amtrak
 - \$1.5 billion for TIGER Discretionary Grants
- Significant accountability, transparency and reporting requirements

American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 Detailed IDOT District / MPO Funding



Funds Apportioned to State

- Eligible Uses:
 - Restoration, repair, construction and other activities under Surface Transportation Program.
 - Passenger and freight rail transportation and port infrastructure projects as described under TIFIA.
- May not be used for conversion of advance construction on previously authorized projects.
- Federal share up to 100%



Funds Apportioned to State

- Act also states priorities for projects to be funded:
 - Completion within 3 years
 - Economically distressed areas
 - Expeditious project delivery

 - \$283,106,175.24
- April 24, 2009 Letting
 - 51 Projects
 - \$155,116,122.87
- June 12, 2009 Letting
 - 49 Projects

ARRA – All Modes

- Projects Awarded 492
- Projects Started 394
- Projects Completed 169

ARRA

- Projects Awarded \$761 million
- Paid to Contractors \$387 million

ARRA - Obligated

- 568 Road Projects
 - \$639 million
- 89 Bridge Projects
 - \$209 million

Total ARRA Expenditures	\$250,520,124	#1 in the nation
Number of direct jobs created/retained	1,690	#2 in the nation
Total Obligated Amount	\$806,514,561	#6 in the nation
Percentage of Total ARRA Apportionment Expended	26.78%	#7 in the nation

Direct Jobs

- Council of Economic Advisors
 - 1 job year per \$92,000
 - 64% Direct
 - 36% Indirect
 - Illinois was within 2% of the expected value.
