



Illinois Computer Science invites applications for multiple teaching faculty positions at **all levels** and in all areas of computer science. We seek highly qualified applicants with a strong commitment to excellence in teaching and the ability to teach at all levels.

Teaching faculty positions are **renewable**, **career-oriented**, **non-tenure-track positions**. Initial appointments are typically at the rank of Instructor, Lecturer, or Teaching Assistant Professor, with the possibility of promotion to the ranks of Senior Instructor, Senior Lecturer, or Teaching Associate Professor and Teaching Professor. Senior-level appointments are available for candidates with significant additional experience, stature, and demonstrated teaching excellence. Multi-year contracts are available for all positions.

Successful applicants will join the department's thriving community of **creative**, **passionate**, **and innovative** teaching and research faculty who contribute to high-quality instruction, curriculum development, and student mentoring. Teaching Professors are expected to have a deep interest in improving pedagogy beyond the CS department, and may take on leadership roles on campus and contribute to best practices and/or education research in the discipline.

Illinois Future Faculty - Postdoctoral Research Associate - Computer Science

Illinois Computer Science invites applications for the "Future Faculty" program. The Future Faculty Program is a selective program offering two-year postdoctoral positions whose goal is to **mentor and prepare outstanding candidates for an academic career in research and teaching**.

Candidates will be paired with a faculty mentor who will serve as their research supervisor. In addition, interested candidates will have the opportunity to teach up to one course per semester with strong mentorship and logistic support that guides candidates in good pedagogical practices. Individuals in the program will be mentored through the faculty job search process and will have the opportunity to be considered for a faculty position at Illinois.

Candidates in all areas of computer science are encouraged to apply. Applicants for this position are expected to have a PhD or equivalent degree in computer science or a closely related field. ABD (all but degree) applicants may apply and confirmation of your completed degree requirements must be provided on or before the start date.
