NSF RCR Instruction Policies – Preliminary Analysis

In selecting the policies for analysis, I started by looking for the plans of the CIC universities:

The only one I could not find on the Web was U of Illinois-UC. I made a note that Indiana U's policy was "unusually hard to find" and Northwestern U's was "hard to find."

Then I set out to find plans from a geographical spread of RU/VH (research university, very high) universities, as listed by the <u>Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of</u> <u>Teaching</u>. The non-CIC universities are:

From this group I chose four diverse universities – Columbia U., Cornell U., Indiana U., and Harvard U. – for preliminary analysis.

I read each of the policies and coded elements of the policy into topics and subtopics using an Excel spreadsheet (see list below).

I asked several colleagues at Ethics CORE to give me feedback on this preliminary analysis, but they were unable to respond due to circumstances beyond their control. The final analysis languished for some time.
