

Program Overview

Scholars conduct communityengaged research for 10 weeks during the summer of 2025

Each scholar is supervised by an academic mentor and a community mentor

- \$4,500 housing stipend
- Flexible scheduling
- Weekly professional development workshops
- Optional community service opportunities
- Strong mentorship
- Broad exposure to public engagement and community-engaged research



Program Expectations






- Must physically be in CU over the summer
- Maximum 20-hours/wk
- Agreed upon 10-week timeline for progress
- Ongoing communication with CAS and research team
- Weekly meetings with both CAS students and staff and with your research team
- Final poster presentation in the community during the last week of the program

Program Details/Schedules





- Timeline applications open January 23rd, interviews occur in starting February, and we choose the cohort by the end of March.
- We will coordinate a meeting between you and your research team before the summer program begins
- Summer research runs from May 28th through August 6th.
- Three stipend payments are made around May 16th, June 16th and July 16th
- Opportunity to continue in the fall based on agreement between you and your faculty and/or community partner


- Get on our e-mail list




