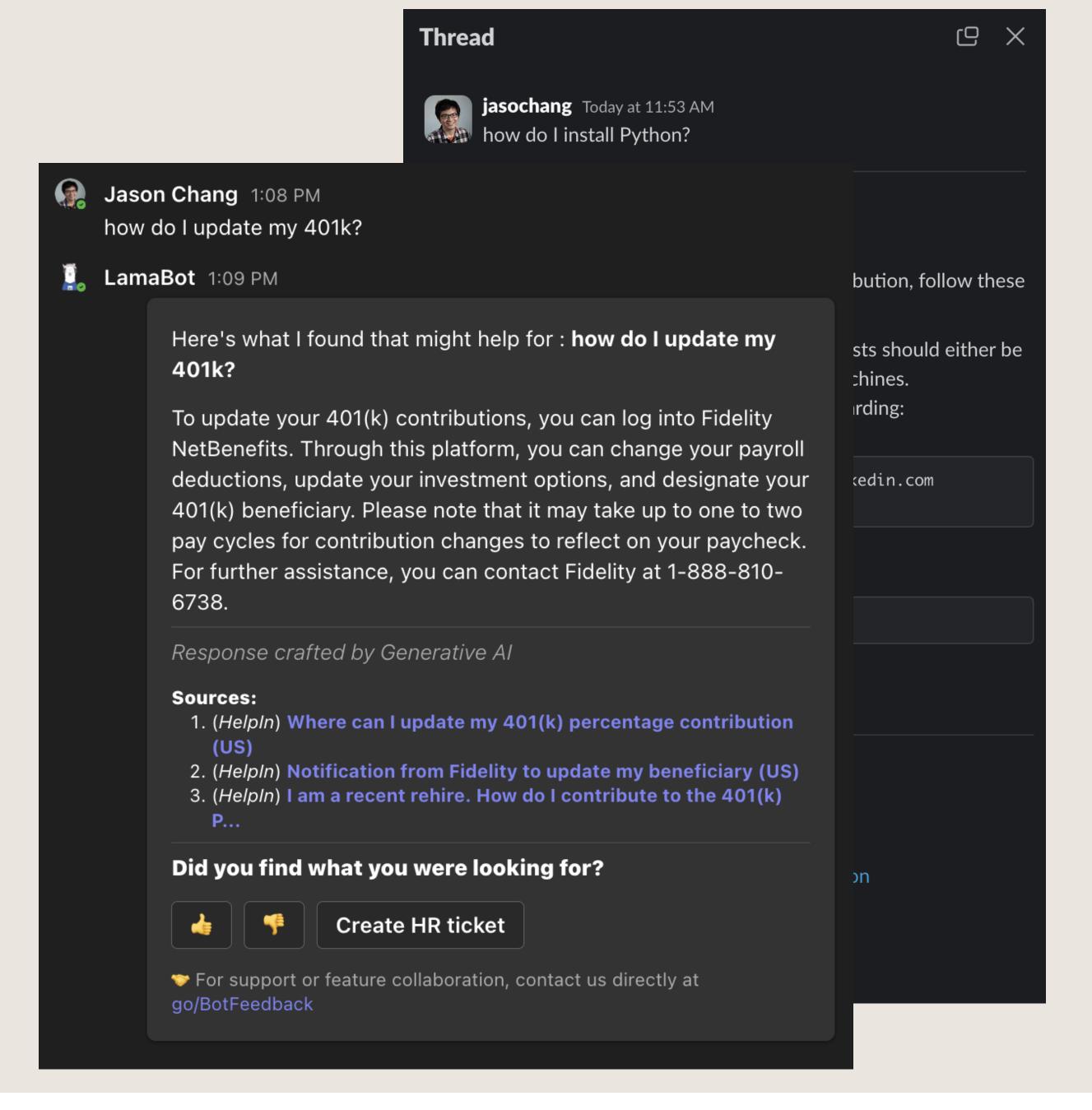

RAG-based chatbot

Integrate with internal tools
Internal knowledge retrieval
Integration with ticketing systems
Access to LDAP user list
Etc...

Just an OpenAl API wrapper?
Yes... but there is still a lot to wrap.
LLMs greatly simplified the ML pipeline
But a product is a lot more than ML



Agentic automation

What is the agentic paradigm?

Basically, run an LLM in a while loop

Give LLMs access to function calls

- 1. LLM will generate a plan and call tool
 - This is still only next token prediction
 - Tool call is JSON argument filling
- 2. Process iterates until ending condition

Natural language problems with complex decisions becomes simple to code

How do we make sure output is good?

Ticket comes in

Triage ticket

Resolve ticket

Some open questions

Can we triage and resolve unseen tickets?

How do we monitor and validate results?

How do we handle errors?

Scaling of infrastructure and agents?

How do we design for a changing world?

Some insights into interview and (useful?) advice



Job Applications

If you are well prepared (a bit more on this later)
then not getting a job is uncorrelated with your abilities
it suck, but you need to just keep trying

It is easier to get a job when the economy is good.

What are some factors that you can control?

Do you have a portfolio? (GitHub history for SWE jobs)

You do need to prepare and pass the technical interview (similar to taking a test).

Apply when there is headcount.

Ask a friend / relative / neighbor / anyone if their company is hiring Large companies typically refresh headcount on January and July

Ask someone at the company for a referral is possible.

Vast majority of cold applications are unseen.

A referral guarantees someone has looked at it.

Job Interviews

Caveat:

- All my interviews (as interviewee) were done prior to covid and chatgpt.
- A massive hiring freeze / layoff wave post covid that only recently (~6 months) is recovering, so I also did not get to interview much after covid and chatgpt.

Tech interview format is relatively standard across the industry

- 1. Recruiter reaches out
- 2. Technical phone screen
- 3. Follow-up technical interview + behavioral questions
- 4. Offer

This is in my experience true for tech (FB, Google, DWave...) and quants (Jane Street, D.E. Shaw...)

Technical Interviews

Example: String have matching braces?

$$()()$$
 = True $(()()$ = False

Why is this part of the interview?

- The correct output is not really the point (but often a minimum requirement)
 - Today, chatgpt can probably puke out code for these leetcode problem (do them!)
- •In 1 hour, I need to figure out if I can work with you
 - Given a problem, can you clarify the requirements for me?
 - Can you then design a solution for me?
 - Given your design, can we talk about it and possibly improve it given our discussion?
 - Can you implement it? (right solution) And also make it resilient?
